

Your Trustees would further report that they have purchased the Fehr farm containing 75 acres, and situated in the town of Manitowoc Rapids, about one and one-half miles from the city. There are two barns, stables and a dwelling house on the farm, and the land is in a fair state of cultivation. An addition, 22x26 was built to the washroom and furnished with a patent dryer, that clothing may be dried in-doors during wet and cold weather.

A pig and hen stable, 20x50, was built, both buildings are built of stone and brick, so that now the Asylum farm is provided not only with the necessary buildings, but also with as substantial buildings as may be found on any farm in the county. Some of the mason work and all the carpenter work was performed by the employes and inmates of the Asylum. Mr. and Mrs. Mueller have attended to the duties of their respective stations with the usual energy and circumspection and to the satisfaction of your Trustees. It affords us great pleasure to be able to report that members of the State Board of Control have frequently visited and thoroughly examined the Asylum, and that they express their full satisfaction with the management of the institution in every particular.

Mr. and Mrs. Mueller were unanimously re-elected to their respective positions for the ensuing year.

Dr. F. S. Luhman has faithfully attended to the duties of his office. He was re-elected. We refer you to his report in regard to the sanitary condition of the Asylum during the past year.

We annex list of inmates, orders drawn, receipts from sale of farm pro-

ducts, farm produce on hand, employes and salaries paid, and physician's report. All of which is submitted for your careful examination.
